January in Maltese History – Some Important Events

January 3, 1427 – King Alfonso incorporates Malta into the Crown of Aragon (Kingdom of Sicily) and promises never to grant Malta as a fief to any third party

January 1, 1523 – the Knights of St John evacuate the island fortress of Rhodes in the Dodecanese, after surrendering on terms to the Ottoman Sultan

January 11, 1693 – a powerful earthquake causes extensive damage, particularly in Valletta and Mdina, where the cathedral is destroyed

January 9, 1732 – the first ever public performance takes place at the Manoel Theatre, making it one of the oldest functioning theatres in Europe

January 18, 1741 – Manoel Pinto de Fonseca, a Portuguese knight, is elected Grand Master

January 17, 1799 – following a failed uprising, Dun Mikiel Xerri, aged 61, and four other Maltese patriots are executed by the French in Valletta

January 8, 1898 – Manwel Dimech publishes the first issue of his weekly paper, *Il-Bandiera tal-Maltin* (The Flag of the Maltese People)

January 20, 1918 – seventy Maltese seamen are lost when HMS Louvain is torpedoed by a German submarine UC22 in the eastern Mediterranean

January 16, 1923 – the aerodrome at Ħal Far is officially opened by Field Marshall Lord Plumer, the Governor and Commander-in-Chief, accompanied by the Maltese Prime Minister and other ministers

January 6, 1926 – the Unione Politica Maltese and Partito Democratico Nazzionalista merge to form the Partit Nazzjonalista

January 1, 2008 – Malta adopts the euro as its national currency, officially joining the Eurozone
