## Pope Francis to visit Hal Far migrant village in 2-3 April visit to Malta and Gozo

Official announcement of the Pope's visit made by Archbishop Charles Scicluna during pontifical mass celebrating the feast of St Paul in Valletta

Pope Francis will visit the migrant open centre at Hal Far when he visits Malta on 2 and 3 April.

The official announcement of the Pope's visit was made at the end of the pontifical mass celebrating the feast of St

Paul in Valletta.

The message was read out by the Vatican's representative in Malta, Alessandro d'Errico.

The Pope will visit Valletta, Floriana, Rabat, Gozo and the Hal Far migrant centre.

Francis was due to come to Malta two years ago but the visit had to be postponed because of the pandemic.

During his homily, Archbishop Charles Scicluna dwelt on the importance of love and noted that Malta had a right to ask for EU solidarity in dealing with migration but it should do so while also showing love towards people in distress at sea by saving them.

The mass was attended by the country's highest authorities, including President George Vella, Prime Minister Robert Abela and Opposition leader Bernard Grech.

European Parliament President Roberta Metsola, on her first visit to Malta since taking on the role, also attended.

day Daphne Caruana Galizia was assassinated, has had the same message, that we protect journalists everywhere and protect all those investigating corruption and criminality. The EU must be a space of protection and no corner in the EU should fail in that obligation. That is why I, as President of the European Parliament, chose to come here to pass on this message and give my commitment that, for the next two and a half years as President, I will continue in this work."Asked for her opinion about the progress in the assassination investigation, she said she welcomes all progress, "but the message is clear, that we will continue working until all the truth comes out."

Later this month, Pope Francis will close a five-day meeting involving dozens of bishops and mayors from the Mediterranean region in the Italian city of Florence.

This meeting follows one held in Bari in 2020, just as the pandemic was starting, but only included the bishops of the region.

At the centre of the meeting will be the topic of migration: What can be done to save people from drowning in the Mediterranean Sea, which Francis has called the "Mare Mortum," meaning the Sea of

Death.

Participants will come from 20 countries, and at least 70 bishops and 60 mayors are expected to attend. The gathering was presented at an online press conference on Thursday, where organizers of the meeting said what made these gatherings unique is the convergence of civil and ecclesial authorities to discuss how they can cooperate with one another on a topic that impacts millions of people. Furthermore, they will engage in a dialogue of culture and civilizations and show that a peaceful coexistence between peoples from different backgrounds is not only desirable but actually possible.

As was the case of the Bari meeting, there is a goal of fostering the common connection with the great Mediterranean region. From a solely religious point of view, there is also talk of these meetings being the launching pad for a Bishops' Conference of the Mediterranean region, much like there are European Bishops' conferences or the Conference of Eastern Churches.

The challenge with this, the organizers have said, is creating the awareness of a common connection between the Mediterranean Churches, which has thus far been hard to accomplish due to rifts and sharply defined borders.

Mare Nostrum was the term used for the Mediterranean Sea by the Roman Empire. This area has geopolitical uniqueness of the Mediterranean: A basin of three continents, a melting pot that sums up the problems of the whole world. There are 21 countries that make up the Mediterranean region are: Albania, Algeria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Cyprus, Egypt, France, Greece, Israel, Italy, Lebanon, Libya, Malta, Monaco, Montenegro, Morocco, Slovenia, Spain, Syria, Tunisia, and Turkey.

Pope Francis won't only be meeting with bishops and mayors, but also with migrants who have arrived in Europe fleeing violence and famine, mostly traveling in rubber boats departing from Libya, Turkey and Morocco.

Pope Francis is also currently scheduled to meet some refugees and their families in his next visit to Malta in April. Cardinal Gualtiero Bassetti, president of the Italian Bishops' Conference said the meeting was "from the perspective of fraternity, to listen to each other. We restart from Florence with the desire to help the Mediterranean return to being what it was, that is, a place of unity and not of conflict, of development and not of death."

Bishop George Bugeja, OFM, the Apostolic Vicar of Tripoli, concelebrated Mass of Thanksgiving, together with Fr Hayden Williams, OFM, and sanctuary rector Fr Gerard Buhagiar at Ta' Pinu Sanctuary on February 5.

Mgr Bugeja was giving thanks to the Lord for the missionary life and ministry entrusted to

Mgr Bugeja started his ministry in Tripoli at a time when Libya was still going through civil unrest and political instability which followed the collapse of the Gaddafi regime in 2011.

Mgr Bugeja was consecrated bishop at the National Sanctuary of Our Lady of Ta' Pinu, on September 4, 2015.





**Agatha Barbara**, KUOM (11 March 1923 - 4 February 2002)<sup>[1]</sup> was borb in Zabbar and she was a Maltese politician, having served as a Labour Member of Parliament and Minister. She was the first woman to serve as president of Malta, and remains the longest-serving woman Member of Parliament in Maltese political history.

Agatha Barbara achieved several significant firsts for women in Malta.

During her long career devoted to social and economic reform, she became the first female MP, the first woman to become a Minister and the first female President of the Republic. As Education Minister, full-time schooling was made compulsory for all children under the age of 16.

She oversaw the establishment of a teacher training college, free tuition, special bus services for school pupils, and the first schools for children with hearing or sight impairments. Perhaps most important, Miss Barbara ensured that science classes were open to girls as well as boys.

Later on in her career, she abolished university fees and introduced equal pay for both men and women, followed by paid maternity leave.

As Employment Minister, the working week was restricted to 40 hours, and retirement pensions and unemployment benefits were introduced.

From 1982 to 1987, she served as President of Malta, becoming the first Maltese woman to achieve that distinction.

Miss Barbara followed in The Queen's footsteps when her image appeared on Malta's banknotes for the first time in 1986.

They were withdrawn from circulation in 1989.

She passed away in Zabbar in February 2002, 20 years ago, at the age of 78.

A statue in her memory was unveiled in her home town in 2006 by Dr Eddie Fenech Adami.

#### MALTA PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA



For over half a century, the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra has been Malta's foremost musical institution.

The orchestra was founded in April 1968. when musicians from the defunct "Commander-in-Chief" (C-in-C) orchestra of the Malta-based British Mediterranean Fleet regrouped as the Manoel Theatre Orchestra. It continued to serve as the theatre's resident orchestra until September 1997, when it became an independent orchestra, taking up the name National Orchestra of Malta. The orchestra became the MPO in 2008 when it expanded into a full-size symphony orchestra, bringing together the best of Maltese talent and musicians from Europe and beyond.

Joseph Sammut, the C-in-C's last conductor, was the orchestra's first conductor, remaining at the helm until 1992. Since then, the orchestra has also been under the direction of Joseph Vella, John Galea, Michael Laus, and Brian Schembri. In 2019, the MPO has

appointed Sergey Smbatyan as Principal Conductor, joining Resident Conductor Michael Laus as part of the orchestra's Artistic Team. The MPO also works with local and international quest conductors and soloists including Michalis Lawrence Renes. Guy Braunstein, Economou, Alexei Volodin, Camilla Tilling, Joseph Calleja, and Enrico Dindo.

As Malta's leading musical ensemble, the MPO averages

more than one performance a week including symphonic concerts, opera productions in Malta and Gozo, community outreach and educational initiatives, as well as various concerts of a lighter nature.

The orchestra has performed in leading venues across the globe, including in the United States, Russia, Germany, Austria, China, Italy, and Belgium, and presently embarks on at least one international tour each concert season.

The MPO is a keen exponent of Maltese composers, regularly performing their works in Malta and overseas, as well as frequently premiering and commissioning new compositions

Through the MPO Academy and the Malta Youth Orchestra, which regularly give concerts across Malta, the MPO is also responsible for the training and professional development of the next generation of Maltese musicians.





#### Michael Laus resident conductor

Michael Laus graduated in piano, harpsichord, composition, and conducting at the Conservatorio Giuseppe Verdi of Milan in 1982. He later participated in master classes in conducting given by George Manahan in the United States and Vladimir Delman in Bologna.

Principal Conductor of Malta's national orchestra for twenty-five years and now its Resident Conductor, he has conducted the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra in symphonic concerts both in Malta's main concert venues and on tour in Belgium and Italy. He has conducted several opera productions which include the Mozart/Da Ponte trilogy, Die Zauberflöte, L'Elisir d'amore, Lucia di Lammermoor, Rigoletto, La Traviata, Otello, Falstaff, La Bohème, Tosca, Madama Butterfly, Gianni Schicchi, Roméo et Juliette, Werther, Pagliacci and L'amico Fritz, as well as lesser-known titles such as Cimarosa's II matrimonio segreto and Nino Rota's La note di un nevrastenico. His performed repertoire includes the major symphonies of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, Handel's Messiah, the Mozart and Verdi Requiems, Jenkins' Mass for Peace and other works from the twentieth and twenty-first centuries with several first performances of works by contemporary composers.

In July, 2016, he conducted the first European performance of Arvo Pärt's Greater Antiphons, in the composer's presence, and in November 2016 he conducted a highly acclaimed performance of

Verdi's Requiem. He opened the first edition of the Valletta International Baroque Festival in 2013 with Vivaldi's Quattro stagioni together with Carmine Lauri, and the second edition with Handel's Messiah. Other soloists with whom he has collaborated include Katia Ricciarelli, Cecilia Gasdia, Joseph Calleja, Brigitte Engerer and Andrea Griminelli, while he also works regularly with his wife, the soprano Miriam Gauci.

Michael Laus has guest-conducted prestigious orchestras such as the Bournemouth Symphony, the Slovak Philharmonic, the New Slovak Radio Symphony Orchestra, the Belgrade Philharmonic, the Orquesta Sinfonica de Asturias, the Berne Symphony Orchestra, L'Orchestra Sinfonica di Pesaro, the Sibiu Philharmonic Orchestra, the Moldavian Symphony Orchestra and the Croatian Chamber Orchestra. He has appeared as music director in operatic productions at the Berne State Theatre and in Oviedo.

He regularly appears in the double role of pianist/harpsichordist and conductor in a concerto repertoire ranging from baroque to twentieth-century works. In this double role, he has won international critical acclaim for his recording of Cyril Scott's Harpsichord Concerto.

Michael Laus has recorded works for the piano and orchestra as well as orchestral music on CD, which have been released on Discover International, Unicorn-Khanchana and Cameo Classics labels. He has appeared on Rai 3, France 3 and Mezzo television channels. He is Associate Professor in Music Studies at the University of Malta. He was the founder and first music director of the Malta Youth Orchestra, and also the founder and director of the Goldberg Ensemble, a choral and instrumental group specializing in the performance of baroque music



# 'dream' job with Canadian Olympic Committee By Kathryn Fraser

After spending years as an elite softball player and coach, a Durham College and UOIT grad is now using her knowledge to support other athletes.

Oshawa native Shannon Galea, 30, joined the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) as a Game Plan specialist last September. "It's a dream come true, it really is," Galea said. Game Plan is a program created in collaboration with the COC, the Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC) and the

Sport Canada and Canadian Olympic and Paralympic Sport Institute Network (COPSIN).

Game Plan helps both current and retired athletes find other passions and transform them into well-rounded individuals. "It's a very interesting program, it's one of the only programs in Canada and it really aligns our sport system," she said.

Game Plan offers support through five areas: medical resources, skill development, education, networking possibilities and career opportunities.

Game Plan advisors are at the forefront, working with athletes and supporting players through the five areas. The advisors are psychologists, life coaches, career counsellors, mental performance coaches and other wellness leaders. Galea's role, as a specialist, is to oversee the work of the advisors, provide resources and develop programs.

Galea earned her degree in Geography and Earth Sciences at McMaster University before graduating from UOIT in 2011 with a Bachelor of Education. Following that, Galea taught health and physical education with the Durham District School Board (DDSB) before continuing to teach internationally.

"Teaching is the foundation for everything that I do, it's full circle," she said. "It's been the foundation for what I create and what I change."

During her tenure at UOIT, she participated heavily in campus athletics. Galea was a member of the Ridgebacks' rowing and squash teams and helped create the women's flag football extramural league, a joint league between UOIT and DC.

Galea also graduated from DC's Sport Business Management Program in 2012, then completed her master's degree in Olympic Studies and Policy at the German Sport University Cologne.

As a result of her connections, passion and education, Galea travelled to more than 40 countries. She lived in Holland, Italy, Belgium, Malta, New Zealand and Australia and played in their respective International Softball Federations.

Galea, 28, received the gold medal in softball at the European Cup in Most, Czech Republic. She played for Caserta, Italy: a team representing Malta at the European Cup. Photo credit: Provided by: Shannon Galea "With the coaching opportunities, I've been able to develop softball in my second nation — I'm actually a dual citizen in Malta," Galea said. "I was able to develop softball in my country which allowed for NCAA coaches to come over and create better opportunities for sport for young women."

Galea said her international travels have made her think more critically about Canada and her involvement at the COC.

"I think about the bigger picture in a different way," she said. "It's really helped me grow into, 'How can I bring this back to Canada? What can I do to bring my Canadian idealism and values [to other countries?] How can we unite Canada? What can we do to make a more active Canada?' That's where my motivations come from."

Initiatives, programs and projects are always being developed and created to help athletes across Canada. Galea said.

"Right now, we are working on a mental health strategy for our athletes," she said. "We have a partnership with Morneau Sheppell (a human resources company) and it's a transition program for athletes who are looking to understand themselves outside of sport. [It will help athletes] re-identify and understand the changes they're going to go through after competing at a high level for many years." When she reflects on her own athletic success, Galea misses the "physical tenacity and challenge" of softball. But she also misses coaching and teaching.

"The impact you can have on a child and a young elite athlete, you can't describe it," she said. "I spent seven years travelling internationally, working with children in every international federation I've played in. I wanted to be a role model for the young athletes that I coached and for the people that I love

## Jenise Spiteri places 21st in snowboard halfpipe qualifiers at Beijing Olympics

Jenise Spiteri made her debut at the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing as the Maltese snowboarder was in action in the women's half pipe qualifiers at the Yunding Snow Park, Zhangjiakou City in Beijing.

Malta is best known for its Mediterranean sun but Beijing Olympic snowboarder Jenise Spiteri is on an unlikely mission to get her island nation into winter sports.

The rainbow-haired Spiteri, who was born in California, has Maltese heritage and is the only athlete representing Malta in the Chinese capital.

She has more than 30,000 subscribers on her YouTube channel and said Wednesday she has been up until "four or five in the morning almost every night"

updating fans on her Olympic adventure.

"It's really cool to see the reaction from people," said the 29-year-old, who finished 21st out of 22 in qualifying for the women's halfpipe, missing the final.

"I've had Maltese people all over the world saying it's so cool to see a Maltese person competing in snowboarding. It's been cool to just reach out."

Spiteri fell on her first run in qualifying but managed to complete her second attempt cleanly. Her score of 25.25 was well behind defending champion Chloe Kim's 87.75 in first place.

In between runs, Spiteri reached into her pocket and took a bite of a bean-paste bun that she had forgotten she put there. "When I was strapping in to drop into that second run I felt in my pocket and had my dumplings in my pocket," she said. "I thought having a little bite of it would soften the blow of falling on that run and give me something sweet to enjoy."

Spiteri, who did not take up snowboarding until she was 18, said she was hoping to inspire sporting late-starters and also promote winter sports in Malta. "It's not hard to go from Malta into the Alps," she said. "If there's someone there who really wants it, they can move not too far away."

That virtual Sunday meeting brings me back to my senses. Once again I feel utter pleasure and joy just to watch the whole family together. That's the only thing Mamà and I are going to miss so much this year — the planned holiday together before summer. Ii's certainly my last wish before I close my eyes for good. Please,

God, make it happen, even if it's a week in Gozo. Thank you, Fiona, for that first foretaste Mama and I had on that Saturday of 9th May, the eve of Mothers' Day, after 9 weeks of being locked up at home.

It has always been pure pleasure for me to be with my family, whether at home, on the terrazzin, on the beach, in a restaurant, in Gozo or abroad. Those have always been my happiest memories. Mama and I travelled all over the place, including twice to Australia, once to USA and Canada and even went on a cruise which took us as far as St. Petersburg in Russia. I always enjoyed every minute but my most memorable trip was the one we took with Owen and Fiona, especially on our tour of Sorrento, Amalfi, Capri and Positano when they were 13 and 15, together with a bunch of students. However, nothing beats our beautiful holiday in that villa surrounded by lakes in Lithuania together with our grandchildren. I enjoyed every minute of that holiday. We were hoping to have a repeat performance this year but was marred by the damned Coronavirus. However, we can always meet at least in Gozo this year, what do you think, Fiona? And we leave the grand family holiday for next year, being our 50th Wedding Anniversay. It may be our very last grand meeting.



### NOSTALGIA THE TRAMPS

'Midalja għall-Qadi tar-Repubblika'

The Tramps was a pop group from Gozo, Malta achieving prominence in the 1970s with their hit song Xemx. This was released under the Circle lable by R. Brizzi in 1975. Its lyrics and

music were written by vocalist Dominic Grech. Xemx and Inti Djamant has remained popular and is also used as the signature tune for the Gozitan television program *Għawdex Illum*. The B side had the track Lilek Irrid with lyrics by Emmanuel Ellis and music by Grech. It also featured Gozitan singer Spiro Sillato.

In 1976 they released another single, under the Canadian lable Duke's Town, which included Kif Qatt Nista and Tfulija. This single was produced by Jo Debono.

'<u>Xemx</u>' is also probably the most locally covered song, with practically all top artists and bands recording the classic or featuring it in live concerts. This song remains one of the biggest hits in Maltese music history.

The members of 'The Tramps' were - singer and main songwriter Dominic Grech, Joe Cassar on keyboard, Spiru Sillato on Bass and Carmel Portelli on Drums. Sadly, Dominic Grech passed away on 23rd August 2005.

In 2020 the music group The Tramps was honoured with the 'Midalja għall-Qadi tar-Repubblika' during the Republic Day ceremony presided by President George Vella.

Other hits include Sinjur Gib II-Paci, the winning song of the 1st International Malta Song



Festival, in 1981, and Kif Qatt Nista' which are today still considered classics. In 1976 & 1978 The Tramps performed for the Maltese communities in Toronto, New York, Melbourne, Sydney and Adelaide - Australia.

MaltaPost is to resume its philatelic series "Malta Buses" by the issue of four stamps illustrating

Malta's iconic coloured buses of past years.

The stamps set is designed by MaltaPost. Photographs by Frans Galea, Richard Stedall, Manuel Cutajar and Leo Grech

These buses were characterised by their high level of customisation and detailing. Individual owner-drivers would add their personal touch throughout the vehicle.

MaltaPost said that owners would add chrome accessories to their 'trucks,' paint messages using the elaborate local 'tberfil' calligraphy, hang objects associated with specific village patron saints and of course, horseshoes for luck.

The stamps will be issued in a sheet of 10 stamps, with each stamp measuring 44mm x 31mm, a comb perforation 14.0 x 13.9 and bearing the Maltese Cross watermark. The sheets measure 118mm x 185mm and were produced by Printex Ltd in the offset process.

The issue consists of 500,000 of the €0.30 stamp, 40,000 of the €0.51 stamp, 48,000 of the €0.59 stamp and 80,000 of the €1.00 stamp.

These stamps will be available from all Post Offices in Malta and Gozo from today, Saturday, the 12th of February. 












#### Document of the Cult of St Paul found in National Archives



A document has been found in the National Archives that dates back to the 17th Century and describes the devotion of the Cult of St Paul throughout the Maltese Islands, from the time of his shipwreck up to the time of the Grandmaster Wignacourt. The document, the first of its kind found in the Archives, is one of six existing copies of this document.

From the arrival of St Paul to the story of hermit Juan Benegas de Cardoba who lived in St Paul's Grotto at Rabat, events are described in detail in the document from the

manuscript of Marc Antonio Haxac dating back to the 17th Century.,


Haxac documents in detail the devotion of the Maltese to St Paul and highlights the life of Benegas in the Rabat grotto. The document is classed as being of great importance because it details the evolvement of the Cult centred around the grotto.

National Archivist Dr Charles Farrugia said the finding of this document in the collection of the Archives was the result of research documenting Court cases from the 17th Century.

He said that one of the researchers, Dr Victor Bonnici, who is also an expert in Latin and the study of languages, discovered this document.

Dr Farrugia said the discovery of this document will now enable a study of any variance from the other existing five documents.

An analysis of the document may enable obtaining further information of the history of the Cult of St Paul in the Maltese Islands and enable further the development of the Maltese identity.
