Resident in the Spotlight VIDYA KANAGATHUNGAM

Vidya was born in the city of Chennai, previously known as Madras, in the South of India in 1928. She is the first of 8 children. Vidya was brought up as a Catholic and was always at the top of her class. When she turned 16 she met a lady at the local shops, she offered Vidya a part-time job in a company that she and her husband owned and told her that she would help her attain her dream of going to University, to become a vet. Vidya was in-



troduced to the world of Beauty and Fashion from the magazines that were shipped to the store from England. In the late 1940's Vidya met the young and dashing Bonney Kanagathungam from Sri Lanka who was studying Business as an International student. It was the start of a beautiful romance. They married in 1950 at a lovely church in Chennai. Vidya flew to Sri Lanka to start a new life with her husband. She was very popular among the ladies in Sri Lanka, as she had learnt how to do manicures, pedicures and the art of make -up from the English magazines she had read whilst growing up. Vidya also had her first child, a son called Michael. Vidya's mother-in-law encouraged Vidya to participate in the famous Max Factor Beauty pageant in Colombo, Sri Lanka. Vidya entered and won! Winning the title was a highlight for Vidya. She received telegrams from Debbie Reynolds and Anne Miller and the modelling contracts came pouring in. The prize for the title was two tickets around the world, a great opportunity for the young couple. Vidya and Bonney visited many countries in Europe and loved England so much that they moved there for 5 years. Vidya went to the Academy of Beauty Culture and Hairdressing in London to qualify in Hairdressing and Beauty Therapy, while Bonney bought and ran a restaurant in the South of London. The restaurant

was successful and Vidya was now qualified and was a Member of the prestigious Eros Coiffure Guild. In 1964, Vidya was pregnant again and returned home to her family, to have her baby girl Nimmi. The family settled into a new and even more successful life back in Chennai. Vidya opened a Beauty Salon in a very famous Hotel and quickly trained a few young girls to work for her, She became the Go-To person, all the young film stars from the state visited her salon. Even Lisa Minelli visited the salon while filming in Chennai. Unfortunately Bonney and Vidya separated around 1966. It was not easy for a lady in the 60's, in India to be a single parent. However, her faith in God and her strength of character pulled her through. Vidya opened her own Hairdressing and Beauty School in Chennai, which became immensely popular with students from all over coming to study at the school. Vidya was invited by the Government of Tamil Nadu, the state Government, to pioneer the Hair and Beauty Department at the Government Woman's' Polytechnic. She lectured there for almost 10 years 3 days a week. At the age of 50 Vidya enrolled into University to do a Masters degree in Sociology. In 1995 at the




