

European Parliament President Roberta Metsola has been ranked one of the world's next top leaders by Time Magazine.




Metsola appeared in the international magazine's 'Time100 Next' list of 100 people from across the world making an impact in various fields, including politics, health, climate, businesses, sport and art.

The President of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen penned the testimonial to President Metsola, saying that Metsola is one who brought the European Union closer to people. Last year, Roberta Metsola made history by becoming the youngest-ever president of the European Parliament. There is one mission above all that she has put at the heart of her presidency: reconnecting the European Union with its citizens. Whenever she travels to one of the bloc's 27 member states, whatever the issues on the agenda, she always finds time to meet with local people. And she repeats a powerful message: Get involved. Do not ever give in to cynicism. You can be the engine of change.

Roberta also works tirelessly to make European institutions better and more transparent. When some European lawmakers were accused of taking bribes during the Qatargate scandal, she advocated tougher anticorruption rules around lobbying and financial disclosures to uphold the Parliament's credibility. She has made it very clear that politicians have to be role models.

Roberta's passion for Europe has led her to the highest seat in the European Parliament: now she is channeling it in the service of all Europeans.

Von der Leyen is the European Commission president.

Discover Malta's best-kept WW2 Secret: The Lascaris War Rooms





During the WWII, Malta was under severe attack on a daily basis so, the rulers on the island, the British, needed to create a system of underground tunnels and chambers to defend the island from key points. 150 feet below the Upper Barrakka Gardens Lascaris War Rooms featured an RAF Sector Fighter Control Room; this is where all lookouts observed and controlled the skies for any incoming attacks. A Filter Room, Anti-aircraft Gun Operations Room and other combined operations rooms are also found in this ultra secret complex. Since there were so many chambers, and because people lived and breathed the air in this underground space, it was mechanically ventilated for the safety of the soldiers and officers defending Britain at war.

During the war, the Lascaris War Rooms were used for several vital defences and in July 1943, General Eisenhower as well as other commanders and and the Saluting Battery in Valletta, the Lascaris War Rooms are now known to be one of Malta's best kept secrets during WWII.

The chambers housed Britain's War Head Quarters in Malta and served as the hub for strategic defence and attack throughout the

Mediterranean. Because of the huge importance of this tunnel system, it was kept top secret and only shared with elite British troops who needed to know of its exact location as well as its operations room.

marshals found this location to be an ideal location for planning of the Invasion of Sicily. After the war, the Lascaris War Rooms were dubbed the Mediterranean Fleet HQ and then taken over by NATO to act as a strategic Communication Centre; acting as an interception for Soviet submarines attacking the Med.

In 1977, the War Rooms were closed down and in 2009 Fondazzjoni Wirt Artna began restorations on the cultural wonder of Malta's past. From war to heritage, a cultural journey that most of Malta's cultural staples embark on. This best kept secret is now open to the public and worth a visit.

DePiro House The Paulist Missionaries opened their first house in New South Wales in January 1964. This was situated in East Sydney, almost in the heart of the city itself. The idea was to be close to the many Maltese migrants who were living close to the area. In 1997 the old house was demolished, to make way for a new building. This incorporates more modern facilities and a bigger chapel, better equipped to cater for the needs of the people.



CHAPEL OF THE ANNUNCIATION

This chapel is situated in the old village of Hal Millieri, which lies between Zurrieq, Qrendi, Mqabba and Kirkop. This village was first





documented in 1419 and its origins date back to Roman and possibly pre-historic times. The chapel was consecrated in around 1480 on the site of an earlier chapel built in the thirteenth century and is a typical example of a Maltese medieval church. To enter the chapel, one has to descend three steps. It measures about 5m wide and 7m long and is divided into five bays by pointed arches arising from the wall piers

The paintings in the chapel of the Annunciation are unique and executed in the fresco technique. Their style and the angular Gothic letters of their inscriptions date them to the middle of the fifteenth century. The frescoes cover all the interior walls of the chapel except the apse, and depict several saints such as Nicholas, Andrew, James, Lawrence, Vincent, John, Paul, Augustine, Blaise, Agatha and Leonard. St George appears twice riding a horse and slaying a dragon.

The 'Teenagers Din l-Art Helwa' group began the cleaning of the chapel in February 1968 and no less than thirteen truckloads of rubble and debris were removed. In 1970 a Trust was set up on the initiative of the Zurrieq Council and the management of the chapel was given to Din l-Art Helwa. Pieces of pottery, carved stone, coins and other historical items were found. The altar was dismantled, and only the large mensa stone and the alter step were retained.

The gilt wooden ratable and the altar front frame were given to the parish church of

Zurrieq. The church had been whitewashed many times covering the precious frescoes. The restoration of the pictures necessitated the removal of the lime, salts and whitewash. Painted plaster about to be detached from the walls was consolidated and made firm by the injection of liquid lime. The plaster was carefully chipped away from the paintings thus extending the amount of paintwork visible.

Unfortunately, almost all of the lower parts of the paintings were lost. Maintenance of these frescoes is ongoing and over the years has involved institutions such as Courtaulds, Opificio delle Pietre Dure, the Malta University, Museums Department, and the Restoration Centre. Humidity and salic aspects are monitored. The chapel is open for visits every first Sunday of the month, from 9.00 am to 12 noon.



freedom from colonial rule.


It shows a process that started before 1964 and continues today. However, 'independence' has its limits. Sovereign states are independent in

terms of sovereignty and autonomy of power. States need to cooperate and depend on each other for their citizens' benefit. After two world wars, Europe needed a political structure to ensure peace.

The quest for peace was the fundamental principle embraced and promoted by the European project's founding fathers. They knew peace grows through unity among nations. They knew that adopting individualistic approaches would lead to mutual







Among Others, The Maltese in Egypt: Life, Crime and Death (1860s-1923), Michael Refalo

When Britain assumed its 'veiled protectorate', Egypt became more attractive the Maltese who. themselves, were British subjects in virtue of the earlier colonization of their island

Britain. Based upon the records of the British Consular Courts in Egypt, this book delves into the relationships, the lives and deaths, the successes and the failures of this community which made Egyptian centres their home.

Egypt was not the most popular migrant destination for the Maltese. Nevertheless, the opportunities for work (those connected to the Suez Canal among others), and the British

quasi-colonial status of the country for most of the period covered by this book, attracted many Maltese to Cairo, Alexandria, Port Said and other Egyptian centres. This book is based upon primary sources which have never been used by Maltese historians to date. It analyses in detail the lives of those migrants and their descendants. Particular attention is devoted to the family, the residence and neighbourhood, the crimes they committed, their death and their succession strategies. Not all Maltese were financially successful; many languished at the bottom rungs of society. All, somehow or other, managed to make of Egypt their home and managed to adapt in a heterogeneous community that included migrants from different localities as well as Egyptians. 
FEAST OF IL-BAMBINA IN MELBOURNE Lonnie Borg MSSP The feast of the

THE ROAD TO INDEPENDENCE

The first stirrings of the movement against Britain's rule in Malta was the anti-British riot of the 7th of June (known historically as the riots of the Sette Giugno) during which

British soldiers killed four Maltese demonstrators. Two years later self-government was granted and the Prince of Wales inaugurated the first Maltese Parliament. Its jurisdiction was limited to internal affairs. The first government was formed by the political groups later merged into the Nationalist. Party. During those years priests ran for elections and Michael Gonzi later to be Archbishop of Malta was a senator representing the Labour Party.

In 1927 the Pro-British Constitutional Party led by Lord Strickland and backed by the Labour Party, won the elections. Then the language question raised its ugly head. With a British Lord as a prime Minister of a pro-British Party in power.... the official use and dominance of Italian, used in the law-courts, the university and the Church did not fit the politics of the time. The government identified the clergy with the Nationalist Party during the language controversy. The clergy fought back, and Malta was soon torn by a political struggle between the government party the ecclesiastical authorities. The Archbishop of Malta, Archbishop Caruana and the newly elected Bishop of Gozo Michael Gonzi (who had left the senate. in 1924) issued a condemnation of mortal sin on all those who voted for the Constitutionals. The British government considered this, interference in politics by the ecclesiastical authorities... the constitution and the forthcoming were suspended. By January differences between Church and Government and the British government were sorted out and in the election which followed The Nationalists were back in power. The British realised that more trouble about the language question would be forthcoming to the possible loss of English as the 'official' language. The constitution was again suspended and direct rule by the British Governor was set up for 14 years.

In 1947 Britain though victorious in World War 2, could sense a new political mood regarding its Empire. A new constitution was offered to Malta; elections were held and the Labour Party under Dom Mintoff won the election. Its relations with the church were smooth and cordial. In 1949 Mintoff split the Labour Party and the Nationalists formed the next few governments with the support of the new Workers' Party under Paul Boffa.

The election of 1955 brought Labour to power and in its hubris, Mintoff proposed integration with the U.K. similar to the constitution of N. Ireland. This would have brough major changes, political and religious and in the campaign Archbishop Gonzi insisted that the status quo of the Church should be preserved. Negotiations broke down as Mintoff was asking for too many economic advantages, especially with the looming closure of the naval dockyard and the refusal of Britain to guarantee the current level of employment. Mintoff resigned and the campaign for independence became the centre of Maltese politics. Rioting began. The campaign was a mixture of politics. party politics, and survival politics. Religion the campaign as Archbishop Gonzi condemned the violence and was accused of siding with the British instead of joining the campaign for independence.

It was a bitter dilemma for the ecclesiastical politics..... and a lot has been written on the political conflict which I am not going to go into. However, it is a fact that the Church was cornered in a three-dimensional situation. If they stay aloof, they would be labelled 'enemies of the people'. If they joined the campaign independence, they would be involving themselves in politics. This was coupled with the fear of the anti-clericalism of the incumbent leader of the Labour Party.... Meanwhile the Catholic Church was developing a more lenient policy towards the world in general, later firmly established in Vatican 2.. Anti clericalism became rampant, socialism promulgated in the Labour media and attacked in independent and partisan media. The campaign became heated so much that the major issue of independence was virtually sidetracked as was question concerning the economic feasibility of an independent Malta. . Anti-clericalism became stronger and more direct: ithe Church became in the eyes of the officials of the Labour party the main antagonist in the fray. This resulted in Mintoff and the leaders of his party being interdicted by the Archbishop in April 1961. A few weeks later came the ban on the Labour papers II-Helsien and the Voice of Malta.

In the elections of 1962, the Nationalist government under Dr. George Borg Olivier won an absolute majority. The Labour party only gained 16 seats out of 50. Mintoff lodged a formal complaint to the U.N. regarding the fairness of the election vis a vis the 'ecclesiastical interference'.... complaint that was dismissed by the U.K.

She loved to cook Maltese food including *mqaret* and *pastizzi* as well as keeping up to date with everything that is happening in Malta through the internet and TV News


from Malta. We convey our condolences to all her family and relatives, Mary, rest in peace – Strieh fil-Paci. Frank Scicluna-Editor

R.M.S. THE KNIGHT OF

MALTA was built by Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson Ltd at the Neptune Yard, Low Walker in Newcastle upon Tyne. [1] She was launched on 2 October 1929 and was completed the following December. [1] The vessel was owned by Cassar Co. Ltd. in Malta. The vessel entered service on 21 February 1930, [4] and it operated between Malta and Syracuse or Tunis. [1] The Knight of Malta was the first purpose-built vessel to operate on a Malta-Sicily route. The Knight

of Malta had her own paquebot postmark which was applied to mail posted on board.

After World War II broke out, the vessel was requisitioned by the Admiralty in July 1940. She was initially an armed boarding vessel, but was later used as a stores carrier.



The Knight of Malta was wrecked on the night of 2–3 March 1941. She was carrying troops from Alexandria to Tobruk, being escorted by the anti-submarine whaler HMSAS Southern Maid, when she ran aground 2 nautical miles (3.7 km) west of Ras Azzaz, Libya. There were no casualties. The destroyer HMS Wryneck was sent to determine the possibility of salvage, and the ship's cargo was salved. On 8 March, the Egyptian steamer Star of Mex also ran aground nearby, but she was towed successfully to Alexandria. Salvage of the Knight of Malta was

abandoned on 10 March, after the corvette HMS Peony and the tug St Issey were attacked.

In 1986, the vessel was depicted on a Malta postage stamp and on a Lm5 silver commemorative coin.

The friars reconfirmed Friar Colin Charles Sammut as minister provincial (second term). Fr. Sammut, from Qawra, was born on November 8, 1981. Festalingwi will address pertinent topics, including local attitudes towards Maltese and English, as well as the role of Maltese in an increasingly multicultural society. Local NGO Inizjamed will lead

a literary workshop, while the Department of English Students Association (DESA) will be testing attendees' literary knowledge at their stand.



Mintoff's National Interest @ IL-ĦAĠAR Il-Ħaġar Museum and Community Cultural Centre in Victoria's Pjazza San Ġorġ is resuming its tenth anniversary Saturday morning lectures on 23 September at 11am. Professor Joseph M. Pirotta has an established reputation for scholarship, objectivity, and flowing style.

He will be offering a preview of his new book "28 April 1958: Mintoff and the National

Interest", signed copies of which will obviously be available. On 30 December 1957 our Legislative Assembly unanimously approved a Break with Britain Resolution moved by Prime Minister Mintoff, the reason being that negotiations over his plan to integrate Malta into the United Kingdom had stalled – and finally broke down by the end of March 1958.

The uncertainty concerning the future of the Naval dockyard was a further problem, culminating in the Government's resignation. On 28 April, the General Workers Union called a protest strike in solidarity, marked by violent incidents and serous property damage. Who was behind the mayhem? Were the day's incidents the spontaneous reaction of an angry population?

What was Dom Mintoff's role? What were the political results and consequences? These are some of the questions that Professor Pirotta, winner of the National Book Council's Prize for Biographical and Historiographic Research, seeks to answer while exploring Mintoff's political mission, his attempts to fulfil it, his modus operandi and his conception of the national interest.

Admission is, as always at II-Ħaġar, free of charge, but seat reservations are recommended to events@heartofgozo.org.mt. This will surely be a good opportunity to inspect the current CARBONARO exhibition!







SILVERWARE WHICH WAS TO BE AUCTIONED BY THE FRENCH EXHIBITED IN RABAT

The Archconfraternity of Saint Joseph, together with the Franciscan Friars of Rabat, will display the silverware that was saved from the French Rule 225 years ago.

This silver was going to be auctioned by the French Government, on Sunday 2 September 1798 but the items were saved. It was the 2nd of September 1798 when the French Republican Commission sent the soldiers to hold the auction of the silver items that were stolen from the convents and churches of Rabat and Mdina.

That day was the feast of Madonna taċ-Ċintura, and the auction was supposed to be held at the Church of Ta' Giesu, but Notary Emmanuele Vitale who was Rector of the Archconfraternity of Saint Joseph gathered a number a large group of people from the Rabat area to prevent this auction from happening, and he succeeded. While the angry people were all gathered in Mdina, the French commander Louis Masson accompanied by two officers came out of Mdina and started waving his sword to try to scare the residents of Rabat.


When they arrived near Ta' Gieżu, the crowd attacked them and the two officers fled, while Masson took refuge in the house of the notary Pietro Antonio Bezzina which is in front of the church of Ta' Gieżu.

Despite this, the crowd jumped on him and threw him from the balcony while the two officers were also killed. When they saw this, 63 French soldiers closed the doors of Mdina and started shooting at the Maltese, who were gathering at Rabat from every corner of the island.

The next day the Notary Emmanuele Vitale, who in the meantime was appointed leader of the Maltese group, took with him 65 Maltese and entered through a small door behind the Mdina Cathedral and fought French unexpectedly in a skirmish that led to several French soldiers killed, while some Maltese also died. It was here that the blockade against the French in Valletta began.

The exhibition will be staged inside the National Shrine of Saint Joseph, Church of Saint Mary of Jesus, in Rabat, as part of the *Rabat Sacrum* activity with the theme 'Treasures hidden in the Rabat'.

Visitors can also visit historic sites free of charge and places not normally open to the general public. The activity will also include several concerts, exhibitions and flowered in churches and convents. This activity is organized by the Rabat Local Council and funded from the financial scheme for Annual Cultural Activities. Rabat Sacrum will be staged by the Rabat Local Council on Saturday 23 September from 7pm onwards and the following day Sunday 24 September from 9am to 12pm.
